The aims of the Council encompass:

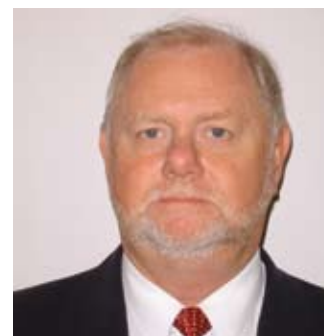
- Disseminating information relating to the proper and appropriate standards of practice in the investigations profession.

Third Vice President – Brian King, Canada

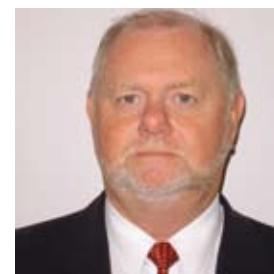
